Transitioning League Cadets and Planning a Spring Recruit Orientation



As a reminder, Action Memo #1 (Homeport>Policy>Regulations) updated the age and grade requirements for the NLCC and NSCC programs. To join the NSCC, a recruit (or League Cadet fleeting up) must have reached age 13 by March 1st of their eighth-grade year. Remember to transition your eligible League Cadets on March 1st to get them started on their Sea Cadet journey.

This also means March is a great time to start the school year's final Recruit Orientation (RO) class ahead of the summer training season. This will allow cadets time at the end of their eighth-grade year to complete RO and attend Sea Cadet Recruit Training (RT) during their first summer as a Sea Cadet.

3 for Free

When a cadet recruits 3 cadets or a combination of 3 cadets/volunteers that remain in the program for a minimum of 90 days, they are eligible to receive the 3 for Free training credit. This credit allows a cadet to attend training for free (up to \$250 dollars).

Inspection Clarification

If an adult was on-boarded through the new online process, ensure that their OMSG and D2L are accounted for appropriately within the inspection. If an adult enrolled prior to the online enrollment and they have not renewed, you may need to verify their status by pulling a Magellan report. Review this in the 2023 Annual Inspection Guide within Homeport under Recent Updates.

As a reminder, last summer we introduced a new <u>online</u> volunteer application process for adults. With approval of the unit CO, adults can sign-up online, saving units from the administrative burden of entering data into Magellan. Additional online enhancements include:

- a) Volunteer renewal
- b) Primary parent application to become a volunteer
- c) Cadet application to become a volunteer (when cadets turn 18 and have graduated)

Adult Volunteer Retirement Process

The Sea Cadet Corps is thankful for each volunteer that spends their time dedicated to training and developing our cadets into outstanding leaders in their communities. Some of our volunteers spend many years in the program; and when they decide to no longer serve in a volunteer position, they may meet the criteria for retirement from the Sea Cadets.

In order to retire from the program, a volunteer must serve favorably as a commanding officer or regional director for at least 3 years, or in another role for a continuous period of no less than 10 years with satisfactory performance (excluding time in Auxiliary status).

Upon a volunteer's retirement, eligibility requirements to volunteer with the Sea Cadets are no longer met because these roles require active memberships in order to meet the safety standards and insurance requirements of the program. If an adult volunteer chooses to step back temporarily from their role at a unit or region level, they may still remain in the program as an active member in an auxiliary role in order to attend trainings and assist with unit activities. If you have questions, reach up through your chain of command.

Call for Adult Volunteers to help out with Uniform Thrift Store

The Uniform Thrift Store is looking for up to 4 volunteers to assist with reducing the uniform backlog. Room, board and travel reimbursement will be provided. The arrival date is 10 March with a departure on 14 March. Volunteers will help out Monday-Thursday, March 11-14, from 7:30am - 3:30pm. The location is the Uniform Thrift Store aboard Naval Station Great Lakes, Illinois. The volunteers will:

- Complete shipments by processing and loading orders.
- Prepare orders by processing requests and supply orders; pulling materials; packing boxes; placing orders in the delivery area.

You must be able to be on your feet for about 10 hours and lift about 40 pounds up to a height of 3 feet.

Units - place your summer uniform orders

Units should place their Uniform Thrift Store orders as soon as possible, if you have cadets that need uniforms for summer training. The Navy is making adjustments to the Uniform Thrift Store starting 01 APR 2024, and there may be delays during this period of transition.

NSWOC Prep Training

For all Sea Cadets (Seaman/Airman & above, Age 14 and up):

Please see attached flier for an NSWOC Prep Training, March 31 to April 6, at Camp Pendleton, CA. This is the first time this training is being offered on the West coast. This class is a prerequisite to attend follow-on NSWOC courses in summertime.

Prerequisites to attend are, 1) Seaman/Airman or above, 2) age 14 years or older, 3), PRT passed at Level 3 or above. More information and other requirements can be found at www.nswoc.org. Due to the number of training days needed and facility availability, this training starts on Easter Sunday. Registration for training is through MAGELLAN.

Summer Training Guidance

Sea Cadet members will start seeing summer training posted online between **March 1st and April 1st**. To get ready for this, the 2024 Summer Training Guidance was sent out in early February and has been posted at Homeport>Advancement Training>Training Guidance. All cadets, parents, volunteers, and training staff should read through it carefully to plan and prepare for a successful training season. If you are running a training as an officer in charge (OIC), work directly with your training group director.

Many families will have their first experience with the new training orders process. A great way to introduce this new process is to have a parent training session during a drill weekend when parents/guardians drop off or pick up their cadets. Get your cadets excited to apply for trainings by talking about this guidance.

2024 US Coast Guard Student Art Contest

Sponsored by the North American Marine Environment Protection Association, cadets and all K-12 students across America are invited to create a *Navigating the Future of Safety and Sustainability* submission. Students are asked to submit an original poster that creatively depicts the relationship between maritime safety, technology innovation, and environmental sustainability in the context of preserving the marine environment. The deadline to submit is Friday, 03 MAY 24. Winning submissions will be used in their 2025 calendar, and an additional prize package will be received to include \$100 dollars. 2024 Naval Horizons STEM Essay Contest

Cadets in high school and college are encouraged to participate in this opportunity that introduces students to cutting-edge STEM topics impacting the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps through an engaging video series. The STEM topics in the video series include space weather, aerospace optometry, epidemiology, machine learning, oceanography, cybersecurity, undersea medicine, and more. Check out the website here.

Students can watch the videos to learn about Naval STEM challenges and the scientists and engineers tackling them. Afterward, students are tasked to write an essay explaining the research, how the STEM professionals in the video inspired them, and to also share their thoughts on the future of the STEM topic.

Up to 5,000 winners will be selected to receive a \$200 dollar cash prize. Additionally, exceptional essays will be designated Naval Horizons Highest Honors on the <u>Naval Horizons website</u>.

Adult Renewals

Adults renewing their membership are reminded to update their personal information to include email addresses. If your email address is a .edu or .mil address, these servers may have firewalls preventing emails from Sterling (the company performing background checks) from going through. The email link from Sterling is valid for 2 weeks from the time it is sent to you. Background checks are performed every 3 years while the Darkness to Light course is taken every year during the renewal process.


