U.S. Coast Guard's Summer Academy Introduction Mission (AIM) Deadline: Friday, 31 MAR 2023

The Friday, **31 March 2023** deadline for the U.S. Coast Guard Summer Academy (USCGA) Introduction Mission (AIM) program is fast approaching. AIM is exclusively for students <u>about to begin their senior year of high school</u>.

For Sea Cadets to apply, they should be:

- ➤ A U.S. citizen (dual citizenship is fine)
- > Between 16 and 18 years of age
- Physically fit, in good health, with weight proportional to height
- Of good moral character
- Academically successful with demonstrated leadership skill and achievement outside the classroom

Please note the deadline to apply is Friday, 31 MARCH 2023.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ** AIM is a two-part application process.

STEP ONE - Cadets will need to apply directly with the USCGA. https://uscga.edu/admissions/aim/apply-to-aim/

STEP TWO - Cadets will also need to apply internally with the USNSCC using this link: https://usnavalseacadet.formstack.com/forms/uscg_aim_application_2023

If cadets have already been accepted into the AIM program for 2023, they'll still need to register in Magellan for the corresponding trainings, which can be found in the Parent Portal (for parents), on Homeport (for cadets), or in Magellan (for volunteers).

Women's History Month

The first women to serve in the U.S. Navy were nurses, beginning with the "Sacred Twenty" appointed after Congress established the Navy Nurse Corps on 13 May 1908.

The first large-scale enlistment of women into the Navy met clerical shortages during World War I, and the second large scale enlistment came months before the United States entered World War II. President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed Public Law 689 creating the Navy's women reserve program on 30 July 1942, which paved the way for officer and enlisted women to enter the Navy.



On 22 February 1974, the Navy designated the first woman as an aviator. On 7 March 1994, less than 30 years ago, the Navy issued the first orders for women to be assigned aboard a combatant ship, USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN-69).

Today, women serve in every rank from seaman to admiral, and in every job from naval aviator to deep-sea diver.
