U.S. Coast Guard's Summer Academy Introduction Mission (AIM)

Deadline is Today

Today is the deadline for the U.S. Coast Guard Summer Academy (USCGA) Introduction Mission (AIM) program. AIM is exclusively for students about to begin their senior year of high school.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ** AIM is a two-part application process.

STEP ONE - Cadets will need to apply directly to the USCGA. https://uscga.edu/admissions/aim/apply-to-aim/

STEP TWO - Cadets will also need to apply internally with the USNSCC using this link: https://usnavalseacadet.formstack.com/forms/uscq_aim_application_2023

If cadets have already been accepted into the AIM program for 2023, they'll still need to register in Magellan for the corresponding trainings which can be found in the Parent Portal (for parents), on Homeport (for cadets), or in Magellan (for volunteers).

PT Gear Transition

We're working with Vanguard to transition away from our old USNSCC PT gear to the new, more easily recognizable Sea Cadets gear. (See photo.)

Note – The previous version continues to be authorized for the foreseeable future as we recognize many cadets have the USNSCC gear. Vanguard is still selling the USNSCC version until the stock is depleted. Units are allowed to have combinations of both versions.

<u>PT SHORTS</u>. Official USNSCC or Sea Cadet PT shorts are authorized for training. Due to a temporary lack of official Sea

Cadet PT shorts on the Vanguard website (resulting from a supply chain shortage), all personnel are authorized *for this summer training season only* (1 June 2023 to 31 August 2023) to wear plain (no stripes or lettering), navy/dark blue shorts similar to the official PT shorts. Shorts must be long enough when worn to fall between 3- to 4-inches above the knee. Purchase athletic shorts from any vendor (i.e. Walmart, Target, etc.).

Women's History Month

During World War I, United States Secretary of the Navy Josephus Daniels decided to take advantage of a loophole in the Naval Act of 1916, which did not specify that only men could enlist. In March 1917, he took the bold — and controversial — step of enlisting women in the Navy as yeomen. Hundreds of women between the ages of 18 and 35 headed to recruiting stations. By the time the United States entered World War I on April 6, 1917, two thousand women had enlisted as "Yeoman (F)." Nicknamed yeomanettes, by the end of the war, the number of female yeomen had increased to 11,000, mostly working clerical duties. This occurred before women had the right to vote in this country.

The list of jobs the Navy considered suitable for women grew as the war went on. Women also



worked as radio and telegraph operators, supervisors for naval shipments, commissary stewards, fingerprint experts, draftsmen, pharmacists, torpedo assemblers, and camouflage designers. Once the Navy realized young women in uniform were good publicity, it trained female yeomen to march and perform basic military drills so they could parade in support of war bond drives, troop send-offs, and other official events where goodwill was valuable.
